Each year, thousands of children in South Florida battle life-threatening cancer, and trips to the park are replaced by trips to the hospital. For some children, this means spending hours alone on public transportation to get treatment. With custom furniture, hand-painted murals and fun accessories, the children's bedrooms are transformed into magical places where they can dream, play and get back some of the joys of just being a kid.

In June, Rooms of Hope honored Naomi, a 3-year-old who has undergone extensive surgery, radiation and chemotherapy to battle Wilms tumor, a rare kidney cancer. With the help of 20 volunteers and more than \$5,000 of in-kind donations from Incapital, Rooms to Go, Fathead, Home Depot, Monster and Kreative Makeovers by interior designer Tamara Roth, Naomi received a princess-inspired dream room where she can play, rest and relax in comfort and style.
